Grant for Businesses Required to stay closed - Local Restrictions Support Grant (LRSG)

Next phase of the LSRG is now available to non-essential retail, leisure, personal care, sports facilities and hospitality businesses who are liable for businesses rates but are closed under lockdown. If you have already successfully applied, Great Yarmouth BC will automatically make payments around the 12 March. Click here for more information

Extra help for hospitality - the Additional Restriction Grants (ARG)

The ARG scheme has been extended. It will provide an extra £2,000 for business-rated companies and £1,000 for non-business-rated companies that must remain closed. Businesses that successfully applied in January should not apply again as Great Yarmouth BC will make payments automatically. Click here for more information

New Grant for seasonal businesses

A new grant payment specifically for seasonal hospitality businesses that can no longer open for Easter as they originally planned. Eligible businesses will need to apply for payments of either £1,000 or £2,000 via the council's website. Click here for more information
