#### Last chance to get Covid-19 business grants as Government scheme set to close

Great Yarmouth Borough Council is making a final call to any eligible local businesses which haven't yet claimed their Covid-19 Government Business Rates Grant, as the scheme is due to close on **Friday, August 28**., the council is making a final call for completed forms from businesses which might be eligible for either:

- A Small Business Rate Relief Grant of £10,000
- A Retail, Hospitality and Leisure Grant of either £10,000 or £25,000, dependent on rateable value.
